

Catholic Men's Fellowship Of St. Dominic Parish



The St. Dominic Parish Catholic Men's Fellowship Group was established at the request of Fr. James Sullivan, pastor of St. Dominic Parish. At the pastor's request a group of men from the parish held their first organizational meeting on December 8, 2007 and at that meeting it was decided the men would meet on the second and fourth Saturday of each month following the 8:00 a.m. Mass. The first meeting was January 12, 2008 with fifteen men in attendance. The men decided to use "Signposts", a series of lesson plans on how to be a Catholic man in the world today. The meetings are open to all men and last for 90 minutes. A typical gathering of the men consists of fifteen minutes of fellowship while enjoying a cup of coffee and a donut followed by a prayer, singing a song, distributing materials that will help to expand our knowledge of our Catholic faith and then the lesson for that meeting is shared.

The goal of St. Dominic Catholic Men's Fellowship Group is to transform the man to become the spiritual leader in their family, parish, workplace and other environments. Today more than ever the Catholic Church is calling men to be the spiritual leaders that is so lacking in our society today.
